









# **Group Leader Positions in Genome Function and Human Disease**

### The Position

The <u>Centre for Genomics and Oncological Research (GENYO)</u> is looking to recruit two outstanding investigators, a Junior and a Senior Group Leader, to establish independent research groups in genomics and human health. Successful applicants will work on any of the following fields: 1) addressing fundamental questions regarding the functioning of the human genome and/or its impact on human health employing omics techniques combined with advanced machine learning and bioinformatics, or 2) The development of advanced therapies for the treatment of cancer or inflammatory diseases.

## The Institute

GENYO (www.genyo.es) has been conceived as a biomedical research space of excellence, oriented towards revealing the fundamental mechanisms of genome function and its impact on human diseases such as cancer and inflammation, with the ultimate goal of transferring the knowledge into new diagnostic and therapeutic tools. GENYO is co-funded by the Andalusian Regional Government, the pharmaceutical company Pfizer and the University of Granada (UGR).



#### The Offer

We are looking for candidates that would like to join us during 2026 as group leaders. Selected applicants will have access to their own lab space and state of the art facilities at GENYO and the UGR. The researcher's salary will be covered by competitive national and international programs designed to attract excellent researchers into the Spanish science system. These include ERC grants, ATRAE (Call open April 24<sup>th</sup> to June 5<sup>th</sup>), Beatriz Galindo Senior, and Ramón y Cajal programs. Successful applicants supported through these calls will be eligible for the tenure track program designed by the University of Granada to stabilize excellent researchers with open-ended contracts upon finalization of the initial appointment. Additional support may be available through translational and clinical research programs such as the Nicolás Monardes C2 call from the Andalusian Government, also for salary support and with close connection with Clinical Management Clinics at Andalusian Hospitals (Unidad de Gestión Clínica).

## **Application Procedure**

- 1. A motivation letter.
- 2. A short CV (max. 4 pages) including a narrative summary of your researcher career (up to 5000 characters), 10 selected publications, and 10 selected grants or awards.
- 3. Details of 3 referees to provide references.
- 4. A brief proposal of your future research plans (maximum 4 pages).
